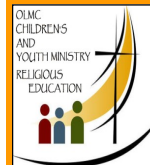

A KNIGHT WITH THE ANGELS

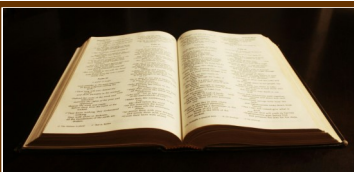
The Knights of Columbus (Balboa Council) invite you to join them for their annual "Knights &

DIOCESE OF ORANGE ANNUAL MISSION CO-OP APPEAL

Next weekend, August 17 & 18, is the weekend for our **Annual Mission Cooperation Appeal.**

The Chapel will welcome Deacon Omar Uriarte at our Masses next weekend. Deacon Omar works with the JC Domond Foundation which serves the poor in Haiti. The goal of this foundation is to help our impoverished brothers and sisters living in the rural area of Marbial by protecting them from the current gang violence and the political unrest. With the help of friends, and benefactors, the foundation currently owns and operates a Catholic kindergarten and primary school while also supporting an orphanage.

They provide water filters to the people of Marbial so they have safe water to drink, cook, and bathe. The foundation built a medical center which was dedicated on June 15, 2022 and also operates a dialysis center in Port-au-Prince.

All funds collected go directly to the foundation and they feel truly blessed to provide resources to the community despite the unrest that is happening in the country of Haiti.

SAINT OF THE WEEK ST. MAXIMILIAN KOLBE

Maximilian Kolbe OFM Conv (1894–1941), born **Raymund Kolbe**; was a Polish Catholic priest who volunteered to die in place of a man named Franciszek Gajowniczek in the German death camp of Auschwitz, during World War II. Kolbe had been active in promoting veneration of the Immaculate Virgin Mary.

It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with his group of prisoners. Targeted for extermination by the Nazis, he was the last of the group to remain alive. After two weeks of dehydration and starvation, the Nazi guards gave him a lethal injection of carbolic acid. St. Maximilian Kolbe died on August 14 and his remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the Assumption of Mary.

On October 10, 1982, Pope Saint John Paul II canonized Kolbe and declared him a martyr of charity. The Catholic Church venerates him as the patron saint of amateur radio operators, drug addicts, political prisoners, families, journalists, and prisoners. **His feast day is August 14th**, the day of his **martyrdom.**
