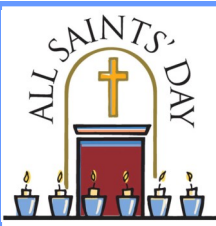

CALLED AND CHOSEN

Father Vincent Capodanno

November 7:30–9:00 PM

Father Vincent Capodanno was a Roman Catholic priest and Maryknoll Missioner who was killed in action while serving as a United States Navy chaplain assigned to a Marine Corps infantry unit during the Vietnam War. He was a posthumous recipient of America's highest military decoration, the Medal of Honor, for heroic actions above and beyond the call of duty.

The Catholic Church has declared him Venerable, a Servant of God, the first of the four stages toward possible sainthood.

In 2017, for the 50th anniversary of Capodanno's death, EWTN collaborated to produce this documentary publicizing his life and his ongoing canonization effort. The film won the Catholic Press Association's 2018 Gabriel Award for Best Religious TV, National Release.

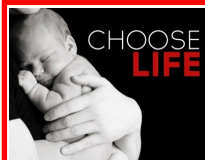
