OUR LADY OF MT. CARMEL EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION SATURDAY, JUNE 14

All parishioners are invited to our third annual **Eucharistic Procession**

on **Saturday**, **June 14** beginning with **8:00 AM Morning Mass** at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church.

Following Mass, **Monsignor Cook** will lead us in procession while carrying **the Most Blessed Sacrament praying the Rosary as we walk.**

We will begin at the church, then over to the blacktop area behind Newport Elementary School blessing the beach and the ocean, then proceeding to Marina Park where Monsignor will **bless the harbor** before returning to the church for the reposing of the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle. We hope to see everyone there!



Pentecost is one of the most ancient feasts of the Church, celebrated early enough to be mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles. It is the 50th day after Easter and it supplants the Jewish feast of Pentecost which took place 50 days after the Passo-

ver and celebrated the sealing of the Old Covenant on Mount Sinai. On Pentecost Sunday, the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary were gathered in the Upper Room where they had seen Christ after His Resurrection. "And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them: And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit" as Christ had promised His Apostles. And, on Pentecost, they were granted the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Their lives were so changed that the Apostles began to preach the Gospel in all of the languages that the Jews who were gathered there spoke, and about 3,000 people were converted and baptized that day. That is why Pentecost is often called "the birthday of the Church." On this day, with the descent of the Holy Spirit, Christ's mission is completed, and the New Covenant is inaugurated.
