




MASS INTENTIONS



St. Junipero Serra Feast Day - July 1

Born at Petra, Majorca, Spain, November 24, 1713, a son of farmers Antonio Nadal Serra and Margarita Rosa Ferrer. In Petra, Serra attended the primary school of the Franciscans. He studied philosophy and theology at the Convento de San Francisco. The date of his ordination to the priesthood is not known, though it probably occurred during the Ember Days of December 1738. Serra obtained his doctorate in theology in 1742 from the Lullian University, Palma. On April 13, 1749, with Francisco Palóu, Serra sailed for America. He landed in Vera Cruz, Mexico on December 7, 1749. He was appointed president of the ex-Jesuit missions of Baja California where he spent the next two decades building missions. On March 28, 1769, Serra left the mission at Loreto on mule-back, arriving at San Diego on July 1. En route, he founded his first mission at San Fernando de Velicatá. Serra devoted the next 15 years of his life to evangelical work in Upper California where he founded nine missions. Serra died at Mission San Carlos, August 28, 1784, at the age of 70 and is buried in the floor of the sanctuary of the church he had built. Pope Francis canonized Junipero Serra on September 23, 2015 in Washington, D.C.

SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES FEAST DAY JUNE 29

June 29th is the feast day in honor of the martyrdom in Rome of these two great apostles, Saints Peter and Paul.

Their veneration has its roots in the very foundations of the Church. 'For their voice has gone forth to all the world.'

These martyrs realized what they taught: they pursued justice, they confessed the truth, and they died for it. "Saint Peter, the first of the apostles, merited to hear these words from Jesus..."I say to you that you are Peter, (the Rock) and on this rock I will build my church..." Although they share the same feast day, they suffered on different days. They are at the origin of her faith and will forever remain her protectors and her guides. To them Rome owes her true greatness. They are both buried under the basilicas in Rome.
