St. Benedict of Norcia Feast Day - July 11

St. Benedict was born at Norcia around 480 AD. He founded twelve monasteries and assigned twelve monks to each of them at Subiaco, Italy. He then traveled to Montecassino where he established another monastery and wrote "The Rule." This simple set of guidelines for how the life of a monk should be lived has become one of the most influential works in all of Western Christendom.

St. Benedict devoted himself to evangelizing the local population who practiced pagan worship.

Shortly before he died on March 21, 547 AD, St. Benedict saw the soul of his deceased sister, Saint Scholastica rising to heaven in the form of a dove. Six days before passing he had his sister's grave opened which he now shares with her on the site of the altar of Apollo.

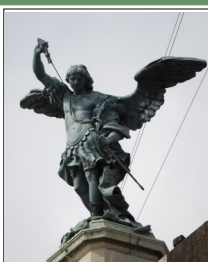

St. Michael Prayer

The prayer to St. Michael

invokes the protection of the archangel Michael in the ongoing spiritual battle for the souls of all mankind. This prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII and its use was instituted in 1886 at the end of Low

Mass, a tradition which continued until the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council. A popular story regarding its origin claims that the Pope wrote this prayer after having a vision of demonic spirits descending on Rome.

Michael is mentioned as one of God's seven archangels in the Book of Enoch and is presented by Revelations 12:7-12 as the warrior angel who cast Satan from heaven. He is therefore traditionally venerated as a protector against the forces of evil and a guardian of the Church. The Prayer to St. Michael is commonly said at the end of the rosary and by some parishes after the conclusion of Mass.
